Motion by Councilperson Dykes to open the meeting to the public, seconded by Councilperson Shoffner, all in favor, all ayes.

Kathy Conner – Louis Avenue

- Asked what Shared Services we have with Bound Brook. Public Works shares equipment at times with Bound Brook and with Franklin. We share the Court in Bound Brook.

Marge Eickhorst – Reid Street

- Asked if there would be overtime for the Police and Public Works for the Battle of

- Bound Brook. Normally no overtime is necessary. Public Works will be putting out barricades and recycling buckets on Friday. Past events have not required overtime.
- Councilperson Shoffner asked if the Borough makes any money on this event. The Staat's House charges a fee for exhibitors but the grounds and battle event are free. The Reformed Church holds a pasta dinner for the re-enactors on Saturday and the Fire Company hosts a breakfast on Sunday. Bound Brook has the lunch on Saturday.

Marie Scannell – Barber Blvd.

- What kind of fees are charged at the Staat's House? There are different fees depending on the exhibit. The fees are collected by the Friends of the Abraham Staat's House and used for lectures and exhibits they sponsor.

Jack Salkeld – Cedar Street

- Spoke about mosquitoes. He feels that we are going to have a big problem come the warm weather. He said there is standing water in the road in front of his house. Councilperson Quinlan said that Public Works will stay on top of cleaning sewers and storm drains and moving standing water. Somerset County will also be spraying for mosquitoes. He also noted that many residences still have pool covers on with standing water which breeds mosquitoes we also have the Canal which brings more mosquitoes to us.

Motion by Councilperson Shoffner to close the meeting to the public, seconded by Councilperson Ormosi, all in favor, all ayes.

Borough Clerk gave an update on the drainage problem between Prospect and Clinton Streets. He took a walk back there with the property owner and the dry well is clog with stones, grass and other debris. Back hoe will be brought in to clean out the dry well. Another dry well behind Armstrong Street is also going to be cleaned out.

Councilperson Dykes asked if the Shred Day notice can be put on the Message Board. Borough Clerk has not received information from the Clean Communities Coordinator. Shred Day and Earth Day Event will be held on April 24th from 8:00 AM to 10:00 AM.
