Howard Ave. During the 1913 Borough election, Herbert Howard received 180 votes to become one of the first Councilmen. Somers Place. George C. Somers was a member of the Borough Council in 1927. La Tourette Ave. on June 4, 1907, with 184 votes, Eugene D. LaTourette was elected first mayor of the borough. The borough had just been incorporated. The election was held at Hose Co. No. 1's truck house on Main Street. He served as mayor until 1913.</p>
